Topic	Workshop Title	Workshop Description
Ethnic Identity	Cesar Chavez and Servant Leadership	Chavez said, "We cannot seek achievement for ourselves and forget about progress and prosperity for our community..." We will examine what this statement means in the context of servant leadership.
Ethnic Identity	Defending Liberty for All: Immigrants' Rights in Arizona	The workshop will provide an overview of national and state constitutional protections of all Arizona residents, including undocumented immigrants as well as a review of the ACLU-AZ's immigrants' rights litigation, legislative, and public education work in Arizona including racial profiling, immigrant detention and due process, and recent anti-immigrant legislation.
Ethnic Identity	Global Youth Leadership	Participants in this session will watch video clips of youth leaders in action from different parts of the globe. Afterwards they will discuss the traits and characteristics these leaders have in common. Finally, participants will develop a personal definition of leadership.
Ethnic Identity	Reclaiming Hope	We will examine how we can use Quetzalcoatl, Huizilopochtli, Tezcatlipoca, and Xipe Totec to reclaim our humanity, and to create a greater sense of hope for ourselves and our communities.
Ethnic Identity	Recognizing Quetzalcoatl, Huizilopochtli, Tezcatlipoca, and Xipe Totec as our Treasure	Recognizing Our Culture and Our Identity as the treasures that they are, and how they can be used to transform our communities.
Ethnic Identity	Who We Are!	Our identities as learners and intellectuals cannot be considered separately from our histories and cultures. Understanding who we are as historic and cultural beings is critical to our intellectual identity.
Ethnic Identity	A Look at Chicana History	This workshop is an investigation into key feminine concepts and women that have contributed to history. This includes a discussion of how resistance is a part of the Chicana historical perspective.
Health	HIV 101	Explore their personal and family values and promote healthy discussion about the risks and behaviors that may put them at risk. Youth will understand the importance in exploring and contribute to learning and protecting themselves.
Health	Sexually Transmitted Infections	Promote healthy discussions about the risks and behaviors that may put individuals at risk of contracting an STI. Youth will explore and contribute to learning how to protect themselves.
Health	Teen Health Information: What You Should Really Know	Learn where to find reliable health information and how it could be useful.
Health	Wellness and Balance	Participants will learn about what wellness is and how to achieve balance in his/her lives. This session will help participants determine how much balance he/she might or might not have his/her lives and develop short and long term goals on how to achieve wellness in his/her life.
